



Spring 1: Naughty Bus/London



Maths

- Odd and even numbers
- Doubling numbers to 8
- Subitising and counting reliably up to 8

Topic

Our focus text for this half term is 'Naughty Bus' and we will be finding out lots of information about London.



We will:

- Read the story 'Naughty Bus' and sequence events from the story.
- Discussions around the focus text: why the bus is naughty and the importance of apologising / forgiveness after an apology.
- Bus role play with chairs set out, tickets, payment.
- Show and Tell- has anyone been to London (or anywhere else) before? Does anyone use a bus locally?
- Draw the route the bus takes on a map with a pencil.
- Singing different songs: The wheels on the bus/London Bridge is falling down.
- Driving vehicles through paint and on to paper.
- Use junk modelling to make London buses
- Create huge maps of the route the bus could take and annotate/label.
- Look at non-fiction books about London and discuss the different London landmarks.
- Comparing London to our local area.
- Writing phrases and sentences about London landmarks.
- Explore a range of books in our book talk sessions including: How the crayons saved the rainbow, The Highway Rat.

PE

In PE this half-term, we focusing on developing our skills in Basketball. PE kits should be brought in a bag with trainers and children should come to school in normal uniform. PE kit consists of plain black or navy short, joggers or leggings and a plain white t-shirt.

Literacy

- We will continue use some clearly identifiable letters to represent sounds in sequence in my writing including identifying and representing initial sounds.
- We will articulate what we intend to write and differentiate between the 'words' that we have written when reading back.

Phonics

- We will be able to identify phase 2 graphemes. We will be able to identify phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs.
- We will learn to blend and segment in order to spell VC and CVC words.
